There came the matter of Item IV, Approval of the HPFL-MPO Policy meeting minutes for January 27, 2021. A motion was made by Warren Byrd and seconded by Chris Bowen to approve the minutes. The motion was unanimously approved.

There came the matter of Item V, Acknowledgement of the HPFL-MPO TIP 2021-2024 Modifications from March 2021.

Armendia Esters provided the following comments related to the HPFL-MPO TIP 2021-2024 Modifications from March 2021:

- New Comments on the LPAs project status were added.
- The approved Amendments from January 27, 2021 were inserted.

    - iv. Forming of Technical Advisory Group (TAG) will initiate in May
- B. Discussion: Project Updates LPAs
  - a. Chris Bowen informed the committee that:
    - i. There is a possibility that new Federal Regulations may have an impact on the total job cost of future construction projects
- C. Discussion: Census Recommendation on MSA
  - a. Andrew Ellard mentioned letters being sent from HPFL-MPO committee members, and other Elected Officials, in opposition to the proposed changes to the MSA.
  - b. No further updates on this matter.

## **Call to Order/Introductions:**

Hattiesburg-Petal-Forrest-Lamar MPO Policy Committee Meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Toby Barker. Voting Delegates were identified.

## **AGENDA SESSION:**

There came the matter of Item III, Approval of the HPFL-MPO Policy Committee Meeting Agenda of January 27, 2021. A motion was made by Chris Bowen and seconded by Tony Ducker to accept the agenda. The motion was unanimously approved.

There came the matter of Item IV, Review and Comment on the HPFL-MPO Policy meeting minutes for October 21, 2020. A motion was made by Chris Bowen and seconded by Tony Ducker to adopt the minutes. The motion was unanimously approved.

There came the matter of Item V, Approve Minutes of the December 29, 2020 Policy Committee Electronic Vote. Adopt the HPFL-MPO Policy Committee Minutes of the electronic vote for the approval of the 2045 MTP HPFL-MPO (Long Range Transportation Plan) and to acknowledge the 2045 MULTIPLAN (Statewide Long Range Transportation Plan) A motion was made by Chris Bowen and seconded by Tony Ducker to adopt the minutes. The motion was unanimously approved.

## There came the matter of Item VI, Approve the proposed amendments to the HPFL-MPO 2021-2024 TIP.

To approve the proposed new projects and re-allocation of funds for projects in the 2021-2024 TIP. A Public Comment Period was held from December 24, 2020 until January 8, 2021 and advertising for the Public Comment period was published on December 24, 2020. No comments were received from the public. The HPFL-MPO Technical Committee recommended the approval of the proposed amendments:

- A. Hall Ave. Western Overpass-new project
  - Construction of an overpass and improvements to Hall Avenue. The project will also include the construction of a roundabout at the intersection of Hall Avenue and Bay Street.
- B. Bus Stop Improvements (BSI) -grouped sidewalk projects
  Hub City Transit plans to create an ongoing sidewalk projects group to enhance pedestrian access and
  ADA accessibility across the service area. Improvements will include sidewalks, shelters and other
  bus stop amenities, pedestrian signals, and crosswalks to increase connectivity, accessibility, and safety
  along bus routes.
- C. 4<sup>th</sup> St. Phase III-allocation of unused federal earmark funds-new project Allocation of the unused funds of the completed 4<sup>th</sup> Street Phase III project to a new project which will include the construction of an 8' multiuse pathway along 4<sup>th</sup> Street from 38<sup>th</sup> Avenue to Thornhill Drive.
- D. <u>Lincoln Road Project (TIP Project I.D. 122)</u> partial re-allocation of funds to the Country Club Road <u>Project (TIP Project I.D. 119)</u>

Partial re-allocation of funds from the Lincoln Road Project to the project at Country Club Road which includes the adaptation of the roadway to a typical urban roadway to increase traffic flow and pedestrian safety. Bicyclists will be accommodated with a shared-use pathway.

### Discussion was held.

Andrew Ellard: Clarification -these items were reviewed by the Policy Committee previously, however, the changes require an official TIP amendment process to approve and, therefore, were processed and placed on the Agenda again. Lamar Rutland confirmed that all of the proposed changes only affect the City of Hattiesburg projects.

A motion was made by Chris Bowen and seconded by Tony Ducker to approve the amendments to the HPFL-MPO 2021-2024 TIP. The motion was unanimously approved.

There came the matter of Item VII, Approve the proposed amendment to the HPFL-MPO 2021-2022 UPWP. The HPFL-MPO Technical Committee recommended the approval of the proposed amendment.

## Discussion was held.

Andrew Ellard: Clarification-the proposed amendment was in response to the Transit Master Plan (TMP) proposals received. The TMP total project cost was, therefore, adjusted in the UPWP under Task 6 (Public Transportation). The funding source for this project is the CARES Act grant and does not include any of the regular programmed UPWP Task 6 funds.

A motion was made by Chris Bowen and seconded by Tony Ducker to approve the amendment to the HPFL-MPO 2021-2022 UPWP. The motion was unanimously approved.

## There came the matter of Item VIII, Approve the amendment of the HPFL-MPO Public Participation Plan (PPP)

The proposed amendment to the PPP addresses the implementation of a new and safe electronic venue for public participation in HPFL-MPO public hearings that does not require physical attendance. This will address any future concerns or difficulties regarding the meeting location. The HPFL-MPO Technical Committee has recommended the approval of the proposed amendment.

- The Public comment period was November 16, 2020 through December 30, 2020.
- A Virtual Public Hearing was scheduled on December 1, 2020 at 5:00 p.m.
- Publication Date of Notice: November 12, 2020
- No public comments were received and no members of the public attended the hearing.

A motion was made by Chris Bowen and seconded by Tony Ducker to approve the amendment to the PPP. The motion was unanimously approved.

There came the matter of Item IX, Consider the proposed opening of the 2021-2024 TIP amendment application process. The HPFL-MPO Technical Committee has recommended to table this item.

### Discussion was held.

Andrew Ellard noted that, although the TIP amendment application process normally opens 6 months after the new TIP is approved, there are projects that are still in the completion phase and there are no funds available for re-allocation at this time.

A motion was made by Chris Bowen and seconded by Tony Ducker to table this item. The motion was unanimously approved.

There came the matter of Item X, Adopt the new Safety Performance Targets, in cooperation with MDOT and the Hub City Transit division of the City of Hattiesburg. The Safety Performance Targets are to be incorporated into future transportation plans, in accordance with the FTA regulations 49 CFR 673.15. The HPFL-MPO Technical Committee has recommended the adoption of these Safety Performance Targets.

## Discussion was held.

Andrew Ellard explained the methodology of gathering the required 5-year data on fatalities, accidents, and other safety categories in order to create the Safety Performance Targets for the Hub City Transit and for the HPFL-MPO transportation plans.

A motion was made by Chris Bowen and seconded by Tony Ducker to adopt the Safety Performance Targets. The motion was unanimously approved.

## There came the matter of Item XI, Acknowledge the Hub City Transit Public Transportation Agency Safety Plan (HCT-PTASP)

The HCT-PTASP includes the new implementation of federal safety standards for all transit agencies. The City of Hattiesburg adopted the HCT-PTASP on December 22, 2020. The HPFL-MPO Technical Committee has recommended the acknowledgement of the HCT-PTASP.

## Discussion was held.

## Chris Bowen:

- Inquiry on the location of specific procedure information in the HCT-PTASP
- General discussion/questions regarding LEOs (law enforcement officers) handling of traffic incidents

Armendia Esters provided the following information as it relates to public transportation:

• Specific procedures are not in the HCT-PTASP, but rather in the separate manuals to which the HCT-PTASP refers. This enables edits to the procedures when new guidelines, laws, and safety practices are received without editing the whole HCT-PTASP. The entire HCT-PTASP is updated annually (in July) and goes to the City Council for approval and to the HPFL-MPO for acknowledgement. Inquiries and concerns regarding any safety concerns may be emailed to <a href="mailto:mpo@hattiesburgms.com">mpo@hattiesburgms.com</a>.

- Status of the new procedures: The new HCT Safety Handbook is being drafted. The handbook will include the cell phone use prohibition during vehicle operation. The newest Drug & Alcohol Policy requirements circular from the FTA will be included
- Specific procedures for accident and incident procedures will be included in the manual to which the HCT-PTASP refers

A motion was made by Chris Bowen and seconded by Tony Ducker to acknowledge the Hub City Transit Public Transportation Agency Safety Plan (HCT-PTASP). The motion was unanimously approved.

## There came the matter of Item XII, Public Comment Opportunity

No public comment at this time.

## There came the matter of Item XIII, Other Business/Local Business

Andrew Ellard, Executive Director of HPFL-MPO, facilitated discussion regarding:

- A. Discussion: Annual Listing of Federally Obligated Projects HPFL-MPO FY20

  Armendia Esters noted that the LPA Engineers have met with Shundreka Givan, FHWA, and the MDOT officials to determine the next steps for the projects to eligible for the obligation of federal funding for FY21.
- B. Discussion: RFP-Transit Master Plan

Andrew Ellard informed the committee of the completion of the agreement for the Transit Master Plan development. The consulting agency is Neel-Schaffer. Project initiation will be in February.

- C. Discussion: Project Updates-LPAs (Local Public Agencies)
  - City of Hattiesburg-Lamar Rutland
    - The City is completing the final phase of the preparing the Country Club Rd. project for MDOT authorization to advertise for bids. This project is expected to be submitted for fund obligation in FY21.
    - The MLK Extension project is the land acquisition phase.
  - Lamar County-Don Walker
    - The County is making progress on the Old Highway 11 project, which is
      in the utilities relocation phase; ROW has been acquired and the final plan
      review is in progress. This project is expected to be submitted for fund
      obligation in FY21.
    - The County's Oak Grove Road/Weathersby Road Roundabout project is in the Environmental phase. Conceptual drawings have been revised and are being reviewed by MDOT.
    - The County's Oak Grove Road/Hegwood Road/Lincoln Road is in the Design phase. The condition/Scope of Work field work has been completed. Preliminary work on intersection improvement design is in progress.

**There came the matter of Item XIV, Meeting Adjournment.** The next scheduled Policy Committee meeting is on April 28, 2021. There being no further business, a motion was made by Chris Bowen and seconded by Tony Ducker. The meeting was adjourned.
